

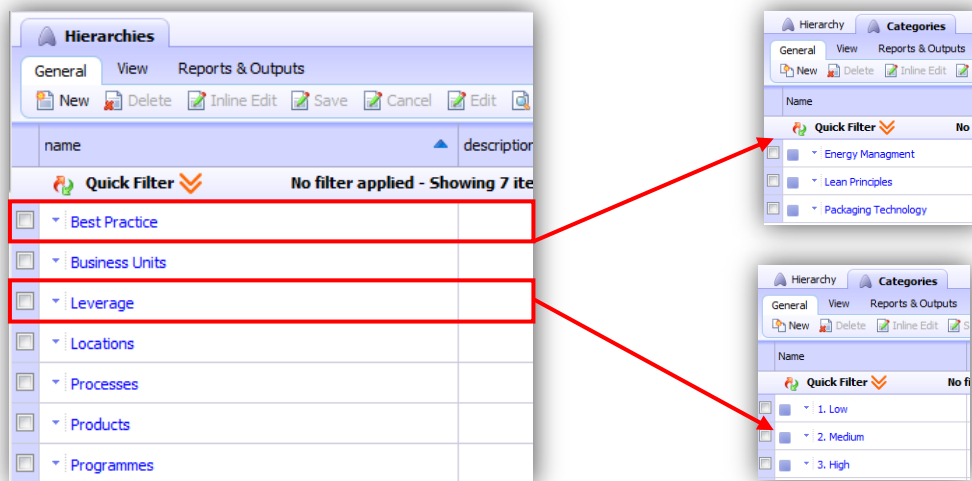

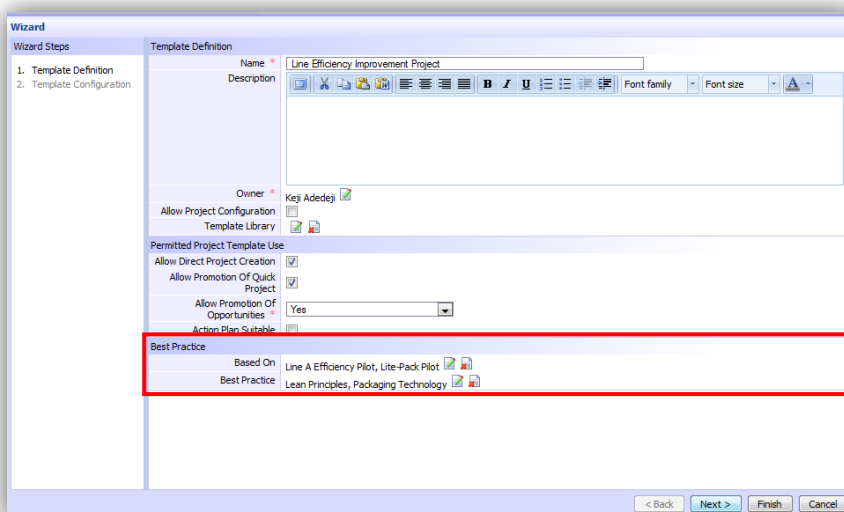
New Features in Version 11.5

Introducing New 'Best Practice' Hierarchies

i-nexus 11.5 further enables organizations to share best practices and reproduce successful processes and performance through the introduction of 2 new **core** hierarchies: 'Best Practice' and 'Leverage', against which an organization can define internally meaningful Best Practice and Leverage categories.



Project Templates and Projects now have a 'Best Practice' section, on the Template Charter or Project Charter pages respectively. In this section, it is possible to specify the 'Best Practice' and 'Leverage' categories which apply to the template or project. There is also a new attribute, called 'Based On', which enables the user to reference best practice projects by basing their Project Template(s) or Project(s) on exemplar projects.

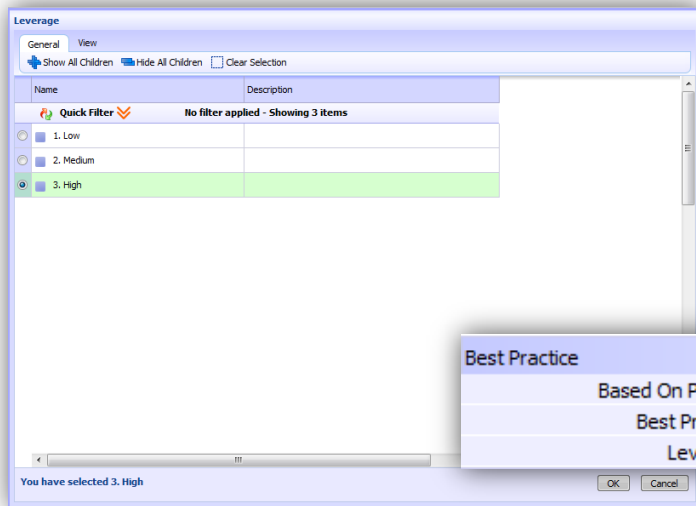


When a Project Template is created using the option 'Based on Existing Project', the 'Based On' field is auto-populated with the selected project. Any projects created using this template will automatically also be 'Based On' the selected project from the template. This can also be entered directly onto a project. It is possible to base a Project Template or Project on multiple projects.

It is also possible to specify one or more 'Best Practice' categories for the Project Template which will be applied to any projects created using that template.

Once at least one Best Practice category has been applied to a Project, it is then possible to apply a single Leverage category to that project.

In the below example, the 'Best Practice' section shows that this project has 'High' leverage against the 'Lean Principles' Best Practice category i.e. it is a good example of a project utilizing Lean Principles and Packaging Technology.

Introducing new Distribution Policies

i-nexus 11.5 introduces two new Benefit/Cost Distribution Policies which can be applied to transactions. The new Distribution Policies are: 'On planned start date' and 'On nth period after planned start date'.

The first policy 'On planned start date' will allocate all of the Benefit/Cost value on a Project's Planned Start Date. The second policy will allocate all of the Benefit/Cost value on a specified number of periods after the Project's Planned Start Date.

Finally, we have also renamed the existing Distribution Policy, previously known as 'Specified number of calendar periods after finish date'. This Distribution Policy is now called: 'Over n periods after finish date'. This is to improve the clarity of what this policy does i.e. it will distribute a transaction value over a number of specified periods after the finish date.
